SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 First Aid:

Ingestion:	If ingested do not induce vomiting! If product has been swallowed drink plenty of water or milk IMMEDIATELY. If the patient is vomiting, continue to offer water or milk. 4.3 Symptoms of Overexposure:

4.4 Acute Health Effects:

SECTION 5: FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 Fire & Explosion hazards:

Level 3 Aerosol (NFPA 30B), (category 1 extremely flammable aerosol). Aerosols may burst at temperatures above 120 °F. Cool uninvolved containers to prevent possible bursting. Aerosols may be projectile hazards when bursting. If aerosols are bursting, stay clear until bursting is complete. Containers may rupture and release flammable liquids or exposed gasses if exposed to the heat of fire. Keep containers cool by spraying them with water until the fire has been extinguished.

5.3 Firefighting Procedures

As in any fire, wear MSHA/NIOSH approved self-contained breathing apparatus (pressure demand) full and protective gear. Keep containers cool until well after the fire is out. Use water spray to cool fire exposed surfaces and to protect personnel. Fight fire upwind. Avoid spraying water directly into storage containers because of danger of boil over. Prevent run off from fire control or dilution from entering sewers, drains, drinking water supply, or any natural waterway. Firefighters must use full bunker gear including NIOSH-approved positive pressure self-contained breathing apparatus to protect against potential hazardous combustion or decomposition products and oxygen deficiencies.

- **Spills:** Before cleaning any spill or leak, individual involved in a spill cleanup must wear appropriate Personal Protective Equipment. Plastic or rubber gloves, respirator, eye protection and apron may be required for clean-up of large spills.
- **Small Spills:** Wear appropriate protective equipment including gloves and protective eyewear. Use a non-combustible material such as vermiculite or sand to soak up the product and place into a container for later disposal.
